

***From Purpose to Practice – Building An Effective Assessment Plan
for Middle and Secondary Schools***

In this session Myron will lay out what elements make up an effective assessment plan that incorporates both knowledge/content along with a global shift to competencies such as the ability to think critically, solve problems, communicate and be socially responsible. From start to finish, our examination of an effective assessment plan will include a thorough exploration of each topic below along with clear tools and examples.

Participants will explore the following topics:

- Purpose of grading and reporting - Having a clear sense of why we would do something will pave the way to figuring out how.
- Targets and rubrics: In this portion we will examine how to build clear, knowledge-rich and competency-based learning objectives.
- Student-monitored, ongoing assessment systems: This segment will explore how students can keep track of their grades and have input and increased ownership over a variety of ongoing assessment models.
- Self-reporting: Students can be active agents in the reporting of their learning and in this section we will cover the why and how.
- Grades: A contemporary model of assessment begs for a grading system to match.
